Dr Tony Tan Keng Yam was appointed the first Vice Chancellor of NUS. The youngest Vice Chancellor in the history of NUS, Dr Tan's ties with the University can be traced back to his undergraduate years when he studied Physics. He graduated with a First Class Honours degree, topping his class in 1962. After completion of his Masters degree at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, he returned to his alma mater as a lecturer with the Physics Department and later with the Department of Mathematics after obtaining his doctorate at the University of Adelaide. He continued to champion the development of higher education in Singapore through his appointments as Minister for Education (1980-1981 and 1985-1991) as well as Minister-in-charge for NUS and Nanyang Technological Institute (1981-1983). In 2005, he was presented the NUS Eminent Alumni Award in recognition of his role as a visionary architect of Singapore's university sector.



He retired from the Cabinet in 2005 and became the Chairman of both Singapore Press Holdings (2005-2011) as well as the National Research Foundation (2006-2011). He was also the Deputy Chairman and Executive Director of the Government of Singapore Investment Corporation.
